*****An instructor-led YQCA certification class will also be offered at the end of the day for each program. You will need indicate if you plan to stay for this optional class during the registration process. More details on registering for the appropriate course through the YQCA website will be sent only to those who plan to stay and attend. You will need to complete an extra step to register through the YQCA platform and pay the additional \$3.00/child fee. The junior day registration is independent from the YQCA class and does not include that additional fee.*****

County Club Day – February 15th

4-H Day is just ahead, Saturday, February 15th, and it's time to be thinking about your projects. 4-H Day will be held at Hamilton Elementary school. Guidelines are included in this newsletter relating to times, ages, etc. Our county club day follows the guidelines for regional with the exception of adding a younger gavel games division. Cloverbuds may participate in Show & Share and club skits.

- ⇒ **Gavel Games:** Basic (7-9), Junior (7-13), and Senior (14 and up). A team may use a younger member to complete their team, but not one from an older age group. Basic is designed to be an introduction to Gavel Games with only 3 problems and no written test. An alternate (5th member) may be used at county, but not at regional competition.
- ⇒ **Show and Share:** For Cloverbuds and 1st and 2nd year members doing their first talk at 4-H Day. We ask that Cloverbuds enter just as other 4-H'ers will. It is an encouraging experience and will not be judged. The 4-H'er will talk with the judge after their presentation.
- ⇒ Demonstrations: Tell or show how to do something. They demonstrate a process and show a finished prod-
- ⇒ **Project Talks:** Tell about the 4-H'ers project, or some aspect of it.
- ⇒ **Public Speaking:** Is an informative presentation on a current affair or public policy topic. An outline is presented to the judge.
- ⇒ Video Presentation-on a Flash Drive or CD: Allows a 4-H'er to include information and visuals not possible to bring to 4-H Day. It is also a possibility for having an entry when a 4H'er can not attend 4-H Day. Not eligible for regional competition.
- ⇒ **Music:** Present an original set of music with measures numbered. Be sure to put your name on it. Copyright laws prohibit photocopying of music. Pre-recorded accompaniment may be used, but any variations should be noted on the written music.
- ⇒ Talent: Includes skits, novelty, juggling, puppets, magic, reading, etc.
- ⇒ **Dance:** Includes square dance and other dance routines choreographed to music.
- ⇒ **Model Meetings:** Join your whole club as they demonstrate their parliamentary procedure skills together as you host a mock meeting. Tips from judges will help your club improve!
- ⇒ **Job Interviews:** Practice and show your public speaking skills via mock interview or a youth volunteer coordinator position. For Seniors only!

County Club Day – February 15th (cont.)

⇒ Favorite Foods: New this year, Favorite Foods will be included and registration will be part of the SignUpGenius links that go out in member emails.

Registration: An email will be shared with everyone on February 1st to begin signing up for individual presentations, check your email! Register on SignUpGenius by 11:59 pm on February 8th.

We hope you will participate in and enjoy 4-H Day. The ultimate objective is that 4-H'ers feel good about who they are and what they have done. It's always encouraging to see the talent and skills of our members. As you watch other 4-H'ers, remember to compliment them on their performances. The judges will determine the top numbers that day in each division. These will be eligible to represent Greenwood County at Regional 4-H Day on Saturday, March 22nd.

"JUNK IN A BUCKET"

"Junk In A Bucket" is a project that is being sponsored by the Madison Pacesetters 4-H Club. They are using this project as their Club Project. The purpose of the project is for the club's Leadership Team to learn how to develop a project and follow through every step in order to make an exhibit at the Greenwood County Fair in a special designated class.

"Junk In A Bucket" will be offered again as a class at the 2025 Greenwood County Fair. The project will begin with a special enrollment through SignUpGenius that will be due by January 15, 2025. Drawings for the buckets will be held at County 4-H Club Day on Saturday, February 15, 2025. Each participant will draw for a random numbered bucket on that day. You do not have to be present in order to participate, but you do need to arrange to pick up your bucket at another time.

Ground Rules for Junk In A Bucket:

- 1. Pre-entry is required and will be due by December 15th. Registration will be open via SignUpGenius. A link to sign up will be emailed out to all 4-H members on December 15th. If you have any issues signing up, please contact the Extension office.
- 2. Random drawings for the buckets will be on Saturday, February 10th, at County 4-H Club Day.
- 3. Photos of each bucket will be taken. NO extra materials may be used in the creation of the project.
- 4. Any of the items in the bucket MAY be cut or reconfigured, but NO items may be added.
- 5. Items in the bucket may be welded. Baling wire may be used to connect items, but may be used ONLY to connect pieces. No extra wire is allowed. Zip Ties may also be used to connect items in the bucket.
- 6. In creating the project, all items in the bucket DO NOT have to be used.
- 7. Projects may be painted, but it is not required.
- 8. ALL buckets and items not used must be returned along with the exhibit to the Greenwood County Fair in July. All "Junk In A Bucket" projects will be exhibited in a special class at the fair.
- 9. Only 4-H enrolled members may participate in this project. This is an individual person project; NOT a team or club project.
- 10. Special prizes will be awarded in the three divisions: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior (ages same as all Greenwood County 4-H Fair activities). Prizes will be based on creativity and originality of the project.
