Enrollment/Re-enrollment for the 2024-2025 4-H year began on October 1st. http://v2.4honline.com



Council Representative

If you haven't already done so, please submit your club's Organization Report providing a list of your club's council representatives and officers to the Extension office by Wednesday, November 1st. **Make sure you have a representative from your club at each council meeting!**

Parents' Committee

Establish a parents' committee this fall. The purpose of a parents' committee is to ensure the club has the necessary leadership to provide positive learning experiences. They also identify and recruit volunteer leaders. They work as a team, but function as a school board or board of directors. They give advice to the club, make recommendations, and provide support to the club leader. Support membership efforts, promote 4-H, assist with problem solving, decision making, training to project leaders, and orientation to new 4-H families. Committee should consist of 3-5 adults, can be elected, selected or appointed, stagger terms, senior member is chair.

Record Keeping and Project Report Forms
